Actual year-to-date income of \$1,114,213 versus year-to-date budgeted income of \$1,115,656 produced a positive variance of \$28,557.



Your Reserve Dollars at Work


Red Leaf Development was chosen by your Board of Directors to complete concrete work in the community. There is a list of approximately thirty locations where the existing concrete must be removed and new concrete poured. Most of the time this is due to tree roots lifting the walkways, driveways and sidewalks.

This time, though, there are two bench pads to be poured. The benches are part of a program the Board adopted two years ago in response to homeowner requests for places to sit and enjoy our beautiful grounds. You've see one of the benches at the clubhouse on the walkway towards the tennis courts. The new benches are slated for the western edge of the Swarthmore/Vanderbilt greenbelt and the south edge of the small green space on Dunbarton that runs from 300 to 500.

- TurfPro is on the property now injecting the root systems of many of our redwood trees. This Deep Root Treatment will help the redwoods retain the moisture they need during the dry summer months.

- Did you know that Target carries paper lawn bags? What a green option! Plus, they stand up for you to fill—so nice!


Fight The Bite

Help us protect you and your community by reporting dead birds and squirrels. Our District and the California Department of Public Health use dead bird reports to help identify increased West Nile virus activity in an area. Crows and magpies are particularly susceptible to the disease, so they make excellent early warning sentinels for virus activity.
